Male and female stars often answer the same questions as differently as if they lived on separate planets.

When Dr. John Gray's *Men Are From Mars, Women Are From Venus* was published in 1992, it was an instant phenomenon. The book—which delves into the differences between how men and women communicate and relate—continues to be a bestseller. To illustrate these male/female differences, Dr. Gray created this metaphor: *Once upon a time, Martians and Venusians met, fell in love and had wonderful relationships together—because they respected and accepted their differences. Then they came to earth and amnesia set in: They forgot they were from different planets.*

Now, we don't know about Toby Keith, Trace Adkins, Tim McGraw, Blake Shelton and other male country stars being Martians (although

we swear we saw some kind of serpentine tail slip out of Blake's shirt one time). And we don't know whether Carrie Underwood, Reba McEntire, Faith Hill, Miranda Lambert and other female country stars have ever walked on the surface of Venus. But we do know that when a male country star and a female country star answer identical questions, the chances of their answers being dead-on identical are kind of like the odds of someone winning the lottery.

It's just one of those "however we feel" situations. But I definitely don't see me without him. I think we'll be together forever.

WHAT ARE YOUR GOALS?

Best-case scenario is keep it going just like it is—just be able to tour when you want to, be able to release songs.

There's no way you can stay on radio forever. If you're talking about the next 20 years, I'm looking at the guys that are 20 years older than me and they're not getting played. I don't think you have to have chart action and I don't think you have to have mainstream radio, but at the same time, I think you have to have a place for your fans to come hear your music and I think those guys do a pretty good job of reaching their fans. So just longevity, that's the only goal.

CARRIE UNDERWOOD

I don't have any as far as, "I wanna win this," and "I want to get this many this," and "I want to sell this." I'm just going with it. If I set too many crazy goals, I think I won't enjoy what's going on around me. I do have my life goals. Someday of course, I'd like to get married, but as far as career, I love what I do and I'm just hoping I can do that for a little longer.
