





# THE STORY BY JON FREEMAN PEOPLE'S COACH

SO MUCH CAN HAPPEN IN A YEAR. A mere 11 months ago, a genuinely shocked Blake Shelton was standing onstage at a rare loss for words after his name was announced as the new CMA Entertainer of the Year. Things only sped up from there: His latest album, *Based on a True Story*..., spawned hit singles like "Sure Be Cool If You Did" and "Boys 'Round Here," before being certified platinum and nominated for Album of the Year at the upcoming CMA Awards. That's just the tip of this sharp, Oklahoma-born iceberg.



Now country fans and Americans of all stripes can rejoice over the return of one of the highest-profile side gigs in the entertainment business. Blake is settling back in his chair as a coach on the fifth season of NBC's eminently watchable singing competition *The Voice*. Along with his frenemy Adam Levine, original coaches Cee Lo Green and Christina Aguilera make their return after a fourth season hiatus. While Blake and Adam are undoubtedly the show's quip-ready alpha dogs, Blake has also enjoyed a great rapport with the zany Cee Lo and glamorous Christina. "They helped make the show what it is," Blake tells *Country Weekly*. "We are a family and I'm glad to have us all back together."

But the big question on everyone's minds, of course, is can Blake guide his team to victory and clinch a remarkable fourth consecutive win? "My prediction for Season 5 is Team Blake dominating once again," says Blake. It must be a daunting task for his fellow coaches.

Danielle Bradbery, the Team Blake member who emerged from the fourth season as the show's youngest champion, chalks up part of Blake's success to his gentle approach. "He knew I was shy and I think his goal with me was just getting me out of my shell and just going onstage and having fun," explains Danielle, whose single "Heart of

Dixie" is out now. "He always told me, 'Try to connect with the audience. Just have fun, and if you need to focus on [some]body and you can't find anybody, look at me when you're singing.' I actually used that advice when I was singing a couple of songs. He believed in me and that was a big part of it."

That belief, says Danielle, was instrumental in giving her the confidence she needed to win. "I thought to myself, 'Well, Blake Shelton [is] telling me this, so it must mean something," she recalls. "It just makes me want to go out there and make him proud." Danielle says the show was a learning experience and introduced her to many new friends. "Being the youngest, I looked up to everybody like brothers and sisters by the end of the competition," she notes.


Teenager Savannah Berry was a member of Team Blake in Season 4 with Danielle and agrees that his relaxed manner helped contestants feel at ease. "He was just always really laidback and I really appreciated that he was so down-to-earth with everyone," she recalls. "He was never really uptight, and just wanted you to be comfortable. It's easier to be who you are as an artist when you're with someone like that."

Season 3 champ Cassadee Pope initially started out as










a rocker with Team Blake, but crossed the gulf to country during her run. Though it's out of his hands now, Blake still checks in on Cassadee. "He's great. He keeps in touch and makes sure everything is running smoothly," praises Cassadee. "He's a good friend and he helps out any way he can." For Blake, it's like being a happy big brother. "It makes me incredibly proud to see how well all the previous team members are doing," he notes, "but to watch Gwen Sebastian, Cassadee and Danielle with music and albums out right now makes it especially gratifying to me personally."

Blake recently brought Cassadee onstage at his Indianapolis concert to perform her single "Wasting All These Tears." "It was so funny the way he introduced me," she says. "He was talking about me and the band started the song and he started singing it, and he stopped himself and said, 'You know what? I think it would be cooler if Cas-



NOT LONG AFTER Blake Shelton announced his Ten Times Crazier Tour, reporters asked the always witty singer what might be different about this particular road show. Blake answered that his shows have always been pretty crazy, before adding with a smile, "This one will be 10" times crazier."

That seemed the obvious retort, but the tour has proven that Blake wasn't kidding or exaggerating. At his recent stop at Nashville's Bridgestone Arena, Blake regaled the audience with funny anecdotes about his career and the TV series that brought him to nationwide attention, The Voice. He also poked a little self-deprecating fun at his earlier image, mainly the long mullet he sported for years. As he started to perform "Some Beach," Blake donned a cowboy hat with a waterfall of hair attached to the back, which had the audience rolling. Another crowd-pleasing moment came when Blake brought out the inimitable Trace Adkins to reprise their hit duet, "Hillbilly Bone."

The good times kept on rocking with Blake's recent hit "Boys 'Round Here," the second single from his album Based on a True Story . . . , but Blake also demonstrated a serious, plaintive side on "Over You," a song he co-wrote about the death of his older brother. Blake told the crowd that he asked his wife, Miranda Lambert, to record the song because he did not think he could sing it night after night in concert. He made it through on this special evening, though.

Said Blake in closing the emotional Music City show: "I'll never forget this night for the rest of my life."

Blake made good on his promise to sing with the pop princess on Christina's Lotus album, and the pair performed their duet live during Season 3.




#### "SOUL MAN" with **JERMAINE** PAUL

Ever the leader, Blake started this 1992 song by one-hit wonder Tom Cochrane, and his Team Blake singers duly followed.




#### "TIMBER, I'M FALLING IN LOVE" with DANIELLE BRADBERY

sadee sang this herself.' And then they had me walk onstage. I didn't expect the crowd reaction!"

Like the other contestants, just being on the show helped Cassadee feel comfortable in the spotlight. "It gave me a big boost of confidence, and I have my fair share of insecurities like everybody," she says, "but that show helped me feel a little more secure about myself and my voice. It made me feel like I didn't need to be something I'm not to be successful—it's working out just by being myself."

Then, sometimes, joining Team

Blake yields excellent future opportunities, as is the case with singer Gwen Sebastian. Gwen originally worked with Blake in Season 2, and though she didn't win, she now serves as a backing vocalist in his touring band in addition to her solo career. She marvels at his ability to juggle so much at once and still keep his cool. "Now that he's got so much going on, I look up to him even more," she says. "Because he's gotta be so tired but you would never know it. He's still a down-to-earth guy—truly loves what he does, truly loves country music. His band is one big happy family. That all boils down to the boss. He wants to make sure everybody is taken care of."



There is no doubt *The Voice* has helped catapult Blake into superstardom, but it's hard for him to put his finger on what he loves most about it, besides the people. "I've made lifelong friends on *The Voice* that I never thought I would even know, from the coaches, to Carson Daly and [producer] Mark Burnett, to the contestants," he offers. "It's changed my life in a positive way."

And while *The Voice* may take him to new fans, the droll Okie says country music will always be home. Winning that Entertainer of the Year honor in 2012 was the affirmation that he needed,

even if he couldn't quite express it at the time. He may be similarly tongue-tied this year, as he's nominated again in the prestigious category for the Nov. 6 CMA Awards.

"It means a lot to me, because everything I do I try to represent country," Blake told *Country Weekly* after last year's win. "Country music is what I live and die by. *The Voice* will come and go and a lot of things will come and go, but country music will always be the thing that I center my life and career around." **CW**
